Where Sequoia Park Will Save Big Trees

This is a map prepared by Howard Gilkey, city landscape engineer, showing the location of the proposed Sequoia Mountain Park of 1547 acres, which the people of Oakland will vote on August 29. The park bond issue is for \$538,000 and will be used to purchase lands within Diamond Canyon, Shepherd's Canyon, Seco Canyon and Redwood Peak and surrounding lands. The recently completed extension of the Skyline Boulevard passes through the upper edge of the proposed park.
