## Rattlesnake Bites Resident Of Harrisburg

Harrisburg, April 20.—(Special).—Wild Cole was bitten by a large rattlesnake while pulling a log chain under a log which he was preparing to load on his wagon. He jerked his hand out from under the log, thinking a briar had stuck him, and brought the snake out with it, the reptile's fang being caught in the flesh of his hand. Cole corded his wrist at once to stop the circulation and soaked his hand in coal oil. From the nearest telephone he summoned a doctor. At last account it was thought that he would suffer no serious consequences from the bite.
